(iv) Transfer the knowledge about effective methodologies and approaches during a JOINT STAFF




Sinem Pala represented our association at the first project meeting held in London.

### Within the framework of the project topic and activities the preliminary report was prepared.

Traditionally known as an emigration country from the 1960s and onwards, Turkey has also been a country of destination for refugees of Turkish descent since the early 20th century. The nature of refugee flows started to change in the 1980s when Turkey began to receive large numbers of individual asylum seekers fleeing from major conflict-ridden countries including Afghanistan, Iraq, Iran, and Somalia. Since 2011, Turkey has experienced a period of unanticipated mass inflows when more than 3 million Syrians1 crossed the border to Turkey as a consequence of the civil war in Syria. When Turkey became the top refugee-hosting country by the end of 2014, the total refugee population was around 1.5 million. The numbers have roughly doubled since then, reaching over 3.3 million people in the beginning of 2017.

Arguments of the best practice	The CURANT-project proposes a mixed use of a set of policy instruments. The project uses these instruments in a new integrated way to provide both a safe living environment as well as guidance. The CURANT- project not only provides a solution for affordable housing
	(rent being €250 a month per person), but also a guaranteed one-on-one integration approach with social and digital learning.
Describe the best practice	A total of 75 cohousing units will be set up through purchase, renovation and private renting. In these units minimum 75 and maximum 135 unaccompanied young refugees cohabit with Flemish buddies for at least 1 year. The buddy helps the refugee with different
Results achieved and impact obtained	<ul> <li>Aspects including digitalization. For example: looking for a job, building a network, learning Dutch.</li> <li>February 2017: The first cohousing units in urban patrimony are renovated, recruitment of the first buddy's and refugees starts, and the site for the modular units is found.</li> <li>February 2018: All cohousing units are ready and the maximum of 75 buddy's and refugees are matched and intensive guidance has begun.</li> <li>April 2018: First evaluation is ready and trajectories are adapted.</li> </ul>
